### Frequent fires in collection trucks !!

Due to mobile batteries and small electronic devices with built-in batteries

In recent years, fires in collection trucks have frequently occurred in the city. The cause is batteries (lithium-ion batteries). Lithium-ion batteries can catch fire if subjected to pressure or strong impact. They may ignite when crushed inside collection trucks, leading to fires.

If a fire breaks out in collection vehicles or processing facilities, it can cause significant losses, and if it



occurs at a facility, collection may be halted until recovery is complete. The City of Yokohama asks citizens to "remove batteries from items where possible and recycle them, and for items with non-removable batteries, separate them from other trash and dispose of them on 'burnable garbage days.'"

# Separation and Disposal of Garbage and Recyclables

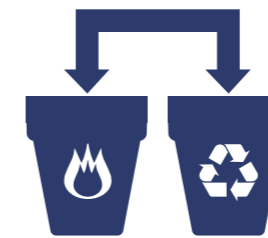
## Key Points for Garbage Disposal in Yokohama City



Put it out by 8 a.m. on the designated day.



Put it in a transparent or semi-transparent bag and dispose of it.



Separate and dispose of garbage and recyclables.

※If you do not follow the sorting rules, there are penalties.



Help prevent littering and keep the collection area clean.

※The collection points are set up and managed by the users.

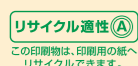

(Do not mix with other garbage)</p> <p><b>Dry-Cell Batteries</b></p> <p>Place in a transparent or semi-transparent bag.
